

- 2,984 families were strengthened in Miami-Dade and Broward County
- Monday Food Distribution began on March 30, 2020, in collaboration with Feeding South Florida and FLIPANY serving approximately 2,000 individuals a week
- KID Supported Foster Care was the **first** in the state to launch virtual foster parent recruiting/ training courses on April 2, 2020
- On June 1, 2020, KID Preschool PLUS and Summer Camp re-opened at 25% capacity to serve those whose parents work front line jobs
- 22 children in our foster homes were adopted •
- 52,914 Meals/Snacks served through KID **Educational Services**
- HIPPY received the national Avima Lombard Award of Excellence and celebrated **126** HIPPY graduates who are ready for Kindergarten
- Family Counseling Center provided 16,198 sessions of therapy
- Foster Family Group Homes served 67 children (14 sibling groups) ages birth to 14 years old
- Benefits Enrollment achieved 126% of outcome goals, serving over 700 families in Miami-Dade
- A record-breaking 35,223 ducks were adopted through the first ever virtual Duck Fest Derby

Innovate. Invent. Transcend. Pivot. While these words all seem to be synonymous with the last year, the fact is that Kids In Distress and Family Central have had innovation woven into the DNA of our organizations since the first pen strokes inked our mission statements, strategic plans, and dreams for a better future for South Florida's children.

KID founder and visionary, Midge Shailer, mixed innovation with excellence which created the mortar for the foundation of KID 41 years ago. Upon her passing, we recently received Midge's "dream" notebook, and throughout its pages were her handwritten plans to address and champion the most vulnerable children of South Florida, ".....by providing innovative treatment in a small community-based facility..." A statement that reminds us that we must continue to evolve as an organization, yet focus our values and impact on each individual child and family that comes across our paths. We had the privilege of honoring Midge at our 40th Anniversary Luncheon in December last year. While we lost a true hero for children in 2019, the legacy that Midge created in 1979 lives on in the changed trajectory of every child touched by her dream.

The "leading through change" example set by our founders has enabled us to stay at the cutting edge of service delivery by both predicting industry shifts in services and programming and weathering the storms of crises. We were incredibly prepared for the national shift in child welfare practice initiated by the Families First Preservation Services Act, as our services continuum shifted toward family preservation and support over 15 years ago. The current policy emphasis on family engagement was a shift our organizations invested in well before it became "best practice", via the launch of our evidence-based prevention programs such as HOMEBUILDERS®, Healthy Families, HIPPY, Kinship Support, and Nurturing Parenting Program.

While no one predicted the COVID-19 Pandemic, our team reacted and innovated immediately to ensure continuity and support to all families enrolled in our programs. We moved 90% of our community-based programs to a virtual environment, became the first foster care licensing agency in Florida to offer training via Zoom, and nearly doubled our touchpoints to families served. Through collaborative efforts we launched a food, diaper, infant formula and school supply weekly distribution that meets the basic needs of over 500 families per week who are struggling to make ends meet in a fragile South Florida economy.

This impact report is dedicated to the memory of Midge and Phil Shailer. Their consummate advocacy for innovation and excellence, and their commitment to giving a voice to the voiceless truly laid the groundwork for the organization(s) that we have become. On their behalf, we remain ready to tackle any challenge for the 20,000+ children we touch every year.
