We anticipate breaking ground on the redevelopment of the property in March 2023 with an occupancy date sometime during the summer of 2023.

Our goal is not to grow to become the largest organization in South Florida. Our mission is to continue to be a place of compassion. trust, and hope for each child who is placed in front of us and we are honored to serve. We have grown to meet the needs of so many of the less fortunate in our community, and THAT is what makes us unique. As counter-culture as it
